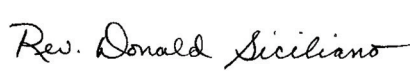

These changes will also allow adequate time between liturgies and enable our priests to provide faithful pastoral care throughout the parish. Each of our three churches will continue to have weekend Masses that fulfill the Sunday obligation.

I know that changes to Mass times can be difficult. Many of us have attended the same Mass for years, sometimes for decades. Those times become part of our family routines, traditions, and spiritual lives. We honor those traditions while also recognizing that becoming one parish calls us to look toward the future together.

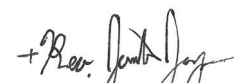
